To: All Clubs Licensed to Hold Herding Events

Subject: New Course D added to Herding Regulations

This communication is to inform your club of a recent change to the AKC Herding Regulations.

A new course called Course D (ranch or stock dog course) has been included into the Herding Program. This course is a unique course which provides for trials consistent with tasks required of a working dog on a ranch, farm or stockyard. Course D work scores a dog's ability to perform practical ranch tasks such as sorting, trailer loading/unloading, moving the herd along alleyways or through mock footbaths, etc. These simulated tasks using sheep or goats as livestock on a customizable course are applicable to real situations showcasing the teamwork involved between dog and handler.

Herding applications with requests to hold Course D will be accepted starting April 2, 2018 for events held on or after July 2, 2018. Clubs will be able to hold this course at all three levels each with their own title; Started (HSDS), Intermediate (HIDS) and Advanced (HXDS). The Master level title will also be available for this course via the usual <u>title application</u>. All current Herding Trial judges will automatically be grandfathered to judge Course D.

The specific change is:

A new chapter will appear starting on page 71 called, Chapter VIII Course D.

This change will be reflected in the next reprinting of the AKC Herding Regulations.
