Other suggestions from the previously published “All Breed Club Activities Guide”

- Have information booths at every opportunity.
- Create and maintain an updated web site for your club.
- Offer Canine Good Citizen Testing and Certificates at Matches and Shows
- Create and hold Responsible Dog Ownership Day every year, same time, same place and publicize it.
- At grand openings, marathons, holiday parades, charity fundraisers, civic organization get-togethers, etc. hand out educational brochures (free upon request from the AKC’s Public Education Dept.
- Visit elder care, veterans’ homes, some hospitals with your low-key “easy rider” dogs. Make it a regular visit as patients look forward to canine visits.
