

## ACT FAQs

**Q: What is the minimum lead time for evaluators to request courses?**

A: Minimum of 2 weeks but more time is appreciated. Evaluators send a request for pre-designed courses to [act@akc.org](mailto:act@akc.org). Evaluators must include with their request the dimensions of the course area, any obstructions (poles/jut outs/floor grates/etc.), gate locations, a list of available equipment, and any other information that would be helpful. To request the use of a dogwalk in ACT 2 requires at least 6,000 sq. ft. or more. A hand drawn picture of the course area with gates shown, locations of poles or other such items with all the measurements on it are very helpful. Phone photos or scans of the hand drawn picture can be sent along with the request for courses. ACT courses are not to be used for training purposes but saved and used only for testing.

**Q: Who designs the courses?**

A: Only Agility Field Reps and AKC approved agility judges. AKC approved agility judges send in courses they have designed for review to [act@akc.org](mailto:act@akc.org).

**Q: If someone completes their 2 Qs in ACT 1 thus acquiring the ACT 1 title, can they then show in ACT 2 that same day?**

A: Yes

**Q: If your dog is entered in all 4 runs (2 runs in ACT 1 & 2 runs in ACT 2) at an event, but only needs one ACT 1 leg, and qualifies, getting that leg from the first run, can you still compete with that dog in the second ACT 1 run on that day?**

A: Yes, you may continue to enter and run in ACT 1 with that dog until such time as that dog has obtained one leg in ACT 2, thus making your dog ineligible for ACT 1 any longer. Your dog may continue to compete in ACT 2 until it has obtained a title in any AKC class (T2B, Premier, Standard, Jumpers or FAST).

**Q: Can someone skip ACT 1 and start right out in ACT 2?**

A: Yes

**Q: Can someone choose to do one run in ACT 1 and one run in ACT 2?**

A: Yes, but legs cannot be combined from ACT 1 & ACT 2 to earn any titles.

**Q: If someone earns their ACT 1 and/or ACT 2 title, does that negate them showing in Novice A?**

A: No – think of it like CGC – that is now a title, but they can still enter Novice A.

**Q: The Regulations for Novice A states, “dogs that have never acquired any AKC agility title” so if a dog has 2 legs in Novice JWW and 1 leg in Novice Standard they can still run in the ACT event?**

A: Yes

**Q: Can a dog wear a choke chain while taking the test?**

A: No, the collar must be of the same type that is allowed in an AKC approved agility trial. If there's a question, ask the evaluator if it's legal or not. The allowable collars are noted in the Regulations for Agility in Chapter 4, Section 9.

**Q: What kind of leash may I use for the test?**

A: One that is legal to be used in an AKC approved agility trial. Please refer to Chapter 4, Section 10.

**Q: Can a dog wear a harness while taking the test?**

A: No

**Q: Can a dog wear anything, such as booties, vet wrap, pants, or have medical stitches while taking the test?**

A: No

**Q: Can a dog that has an ACT 2 Title enter Act 1?**

A: No, but they can show in ACT 2 until they have obtained an AKC Novice Standard, Novice JWW, Novice FAST, Premier or Time 2 Beat title.

**Q: If my dog and I have earned an ACT 1 and/or an ACT 2 title are we eligible for Novice A if we meet the other requirements?**

A: Yes, you can enter Novice A classes if you are otherwise eligible. ACT 1 or ACT 2 titles do not exclude you from entering Novice A.

**Q: Can I evaluate a dog that I am a co-owner of if it's not living in my household?**

A: No

**Q: Can I evaluate someone such as a significant other, child, spouse, etc. and then just give them an NQ so they can have the ACT experience?**

A: No

**Q: If a dog/handler team is pre-entered in an ACT event and completes an agility title prior to the ACT event, is the dog/handler still eligible to participate in the pre-entered ACT event?**

A: No, the dog / handler team may not compete in the pre-entered ACT event or any other ACT event with that dog.

**Q: Is the club/evaluator required to refund the entry fees?**

A: The club/evaluator must refund all fees.
