REQUIREMENTS FOR SANCTIONED EVENTS

There are two types of Sanctioned Events: Informal Sanctioned Tests [Plan B], and Qualifying Sanctioned Tests [Plan A].

An Information Sanctioned Test [Plan B] is one at which dogs compete, but not for titles, held by a club by applying for, and obtaining, the Sanction of The American Kennel Club. Results and/or reports of these tests are not required to be filed with the AKC.

Qualifying Sanctioned Tests [Plan A] are formal hunting tests at which no titles are awarded, and are conducted as if they were licensed tests. In order for a club to be eligible to apply for its first licensed hunting test, it is required to hold a minimum of two Qualifying Sanctioned hunting tests at least 6 months apart. For this type of event it is necessary, after approval of the dates and judges, to submit a copy of the premium list and entry form, which the club must prepare following the same format of those used for licensed events. At the conclusion of the judging, hunt test clubs shall provide the judge with a book containing a page for each class judged with full particulars of all dogs that qualified. The judges shall sign each page indicating approval of the awards. The field trial secretary shall also sign each page certifying to the judges signatures, and to the number of starters in the stake, and shall file said judges book, together with all original entry forms for each dog, and complete report of said test (the inside cover of judges book) with The American Kennel Club within seven (7) days after conclusion of the event. Judges books are automatically furnished to the club after their application for a Qualifying trial has been approved.
