#### DESCRIPTION AND STANDARD OF POINTS

#### OF THE IDEAL POODLE

I

General Appearance, Carriage and Condition. That of a very active, intelligent, smart and elegant-looking dog, squarely built, well proportioned and carrying himself proudly. Properly clipped in the traditional fashion and carefully groomed, the Poodle has about him an air of distinction and dignity peculiar to himself.

#### II

- Head and Expression. (A) Skull - should be slightly full and moderately peaked with a slight stop. Cheek bones and muscles flat.

  Eyes set far enough apart to indicate ample brain capacity.

  Muzzle -- long, straight and fine, but strong without lippiness. The chin definite enough to preclude snipiness. Teeth white, strong and level. Nose sharp with well defined nostrils.
  - (B) Eyes oval shape, very dark, full of fire and intelligence.
  - (C) Ears set low and hanging close to the head. The leather long, wide and heavily feathered when drawn forward almost reaches the nose.

#### III

Neck. Well proportioned, strong and long enough to admit of the head being carried high and with dignity. Skin snug at throat.

#### IV

Shoulders. Strong, muscular, angulated at the point of the shoulder and the elbow joint, sloping well back.

V

Body. The chest deep and moderately wide. The ribs well sprung

and braced up. The back short, strong and very slightly hollowed, with the loins broad and muscular. (Bitches may be slightly longer in back than dogs.)

VI

Tail. Set on rather high, docked, and carried gaily. Never curled or carried over the back.

#### VII

Legs. The forelegs straight from shoulders with plenty of bone and muscle. Hindlegs very muscular, stifles well bent, and hocks well let down. Hindquarters well developed with the second thigh showing both width and muscle.

#### VIII

Feet. Rather small and of good oval shape. Toes well arched and close, pads thick and hard.

IX

Coat. (A) Quality:

<u>Curly Poodles:</u> Very profuse, of harsh texture, even length, frizzy or curly, not at all open.

Corded Poodles: Very thick, hanging in tight, even cords.

(B) Clip: Clipping either in the traditional "Continental" or "English Saddle" style is correct. In the "Continental" clip the hindquarters are shaved, with pom-poms on hips (optional), and in the "English Saddle" clip, the hindquarters are covered with a short blanket of hair. In both these clips the rest of the body must be left in full coat. The face, feet, legs and tail must be shaved. leaving bracelets on all four legs, and a pom-pom at the end of the tail. The top knot and feather on the ears must be long and profuse, so as not to lose the very essential poodle expression. A dog under a year old may be shown with the coat long except the face, feet and base of tail, which should be shaved. Any Poodle clipped in any style other than the above mentioned shall be disqualified from the show ring.

X

Color. Any solid color. All but the browns have black noses, lips and eyelids. The browns and apricots may have liver noses and dark amber eyes. In all colors toenails either black or the same color as the dog.

XI

Gait. A straightforward trot with light springy, action. Head and tail carried high.

Size. The Standard Poodle is fifteen inches or over at the shoulder.

### DESCRIPTION AND STANDARD OF POINTS

# OF THE IDEAL MINIATURE POODLE

- a. Same as Large Poodle.
- b. Size Under fifteen inches at shoulders.
- c. Value of Points Same as Large Poodle.
- d. So long as the dog is definitely a Miniature, diminutiveness is only the deciding factor when all other points are equal; soundness and activity are every whit as necessary in a Miniature as they are in a large Poodle and as these traits can only be seen when the dog is in action, it is imperative that Miniatures be moved in the ring as fully and decidedly as large Poodles.

The Board will then consider such application and if it approves of the name selected will grant the right to the use of such name."

(At present the fee is twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars.)

On motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that the following amendment to Chapter 18, Section 2, of Rules applying to Registration and Dog Shows, be approved:

By inserting in said Section after the word "cover" and before the word "This" the words "or title page", so that said Section as amended will read as follows:

"Every catalogue must bear on its cover or title page: 'This show is held under American Kennel Club Rules.'"

On motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that the following amendment to Chapter 2, Section 12 of Rules applying to Registration and Field Trials, be approved:

By striking out the said Section as now worded and inserting in place thereof a Section to read as follows:

"If any person or persons shall desire to make use of a kennel or trade name in registering or running dogs, application for the right to use such name must be made to The American Kennel Club on a form which will be supplied by said Club upon request, and such application must be accompanied by a fee, the amount of which shall be determined by the Board of Directors of The American Kennel Club. The Board will then consider such application and if it approves of the name selected will grant the right to the use of such name."

(At present the fee is twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars.)

On motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that Chapter 15, Section 1 of Rules applying to Registration and Field Trials - Special Rules and Championship Points applying to Foxhounds be amended by adding at the end of said Section the words "provided the trial is of not less than four days' duration."

On motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that the following amendments to Rules applying to Registration and Field Trials - Special Rules and Championship Points applying to Retrievers and Irish Water Spaniels - be approved:

By striking out said Chapter 16 as now worded and inserting a new Chapter 16, as follows:

CHAPTER 16.

Section 1. Field Trial clubs or specialty clubs formed for the improvement of any one of the several breeds of Retrievers and/or Irish Water Spaniels may give field trial stakes in which one of said breeds only may compete, or in which more than one of said breeds may compete together.

Championship points may be awarded where two or more of said breeds compete together in a mixed stake as well as where

a separate stake has been provided for each breed.

Only pure-bred retrievers and/or Irish Water Spaniels may be entered in field trials.

Section 2. In stakes for Retrievers and/or Irish Water Spaniels, the order of running shall be decided by lot at the draw, dogs worked by the same person or belonging to the same owner being separated when possible. At the end of the first series, the Judges will call up all dogs which they wish to try further and will cause them to be run in additional series until the stake is decided. Judges shall in their discretion determine the number of dogs that shall be worked simultaneously.

Section 3. In Novice Handler Stakes dogs must be handled by persons who have never handled a placed dog in any licensed or member club Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Trial in the United States nor in any Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Trial in Great Britain or Canada.

Section 4. In all stakes the dogs shall be regularly shot over in the customary manner by guns appointed by the Field Trial Committee and in licensed or member club trials shall be worked both on land and in water in all stakes. No handler shall carry any training or other handling equipment (except whistle) exposed or in such manner that it may be used as a steadying aid or threat. At the discretion of the judges a handler may shoot from the blind or an official gun may shoot for him. If, in the opinion of the judges, conditions are not suitable for testing puppies in the water, this stake shall be abandoned.

Section 5. Only stakes which are run on game birds and on both land and water shall be permitted to carry championship points.

Section 6. Judges shall have the power to disqualify any dog which shall not appear within fifteen minutes of the time designated for its turn to be tried.

Section 7. Judges shall have the power to turn out of the stake any dog which does not obey its handler and any handler who interferes wilfully with another handler or his dog, and the power to exclude from competition bitches in season or any dog which the Judges may consider unfit to compete. The entry fees of all such dogs shall be forfeited except in cases of bitches in season.

Section 8. The owner or agent entering a dog in a Trial does so at his own risk, and agrees to abide by the rules of The American Kennel Club.

Section 9. In the event of the weather proving unsuitable for holding the Trials, it shall be in the power of the Field Trial Committee to postpone the Trials up to 30 days, provided such postponements do not conflict with any other Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial, and that notice of each postponement is immediately forwarded to The American Kennel Club. After postponements for 30 days the provisions of Section 10 of this Chapter shall come into operation.

Section 10. In the event of the weather still proving unsuitable, after postponements for 30 days, the Field Trial Committee may then abandon the Trial at any time, on returning the entry fees to the competitors. If, from unforeseen circumstances, the Field Trial Committee deem it advisable to alter the date of the Trial after the closing of the entries, this may be done with the consent of the American Kennel Club and by sending formal notice to all competitors, who may exercise the option of cancelling their entries within four days from the date of such notice, in which event their entry fees will be returned to them. All entries, however, in regard to which no such option is exercised, will stand good for the Trial at its altered date.

Section 11. The decisions of the Field Trial Committee present shall be final and conclusive in all matters arising at the Meeting, and shall bind all parties, subject however to the rules of The American Kennel Club.

Section 12. After a Field Trial Committee has selected field trial grounds no dog shall be trained on that part of the grounds to be used for the trials.

Section 13. Splitting of prizes and/or places at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial is prohibited.

Section 14. No gun smaller than twelve gauge shall be used in Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Stakes carrying championship points. The size of shot and load to be used shall be approved by the Field Trial Committee of the Club holding the field trial.

Section 15. The regular official stakes at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Trial shall be "Puppy Stake", "Derby Stake", "Novice Stake", "Non-Winners Stake", "Open All Age Stake" and "Limited All Age Stake".

Section 16. A Puppy Stake at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial shall be for dogs six months and not exceeding twelve months of age. The age of a dog shall be calculated up to and inclusive of the day preceding the first day of the Trial.

Section 17. A Derby Stake at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial shall be for dogs whelped on or after the first day of January of the year preceding that year in which the stake is run.

Section 18. A Novice Stake at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial shall be for dogs which never have won first place in a Novice Stake nor any place or Certificate of Merit in any other regular official Field Trial Stake at a licensed or member club trial. Wins in Puppy or Derby Stakes excepted. Only dogs whelped in the United States or Canada, and dogs that have been imported and registered in the American Kennel Club Stud Book prior to reaching the age of one year, shall be eligible.

Section 19. A Non-Winners Stake at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial shall be for dogs which have never won first, second, third or fourth place in an Open All Age or Limited All Age Stake or won first place in a Non-Winners Stake at a licensed or member club trial.

Section 20. An Open All Age Stake at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial shall be for all dogs over six months of age.

Section 21. A Limited All Age Stake at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial shall be for dogs over six months of age that have previously been placed or received an American Kennel Club Certificate of Merit in an Open All Age Stake or that have been placed first, second or third in a Derby, Novice or Non-Winners Stake at a licensed or member club trial.

Section 22. A Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel shall become a Field Trial Champion of record after having won points in open all age and/or limited all age stakes at Field Trials of member clubs of the American Kennel Club or at field trials of non-member clubs licensed by the American Kennel Club to hold field trials.

Section 23. The total number of points required for a championship, the number of places in a stake for which points may be acquired, the number of points to be acquired for each place, and the number of starters required and their qualifications for eligibility to acquire points in each stake shall be fixed and determined by the Board of Directors of the American Kennel Club.

(At present to acquire a Field Trial championship a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel must win a total of 10 points, which may be acquired as follows: In each open all age or limited all age stake there must be at least 12 starters and a winner of 1st place shall be credited with 5 points, 2nd place - 3 points, and 3rd place - 1 point, but before acquiring a champion-ship a dog must win first place and acquire 5 points in at least one open all age or limited all age stake and not more than 5 points of the required 10 shall be acquired in stakes limited to any one breed of Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel.)

On motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that the following amendments to the Standard Procedure for Non-Slip Retriever Trials be approved:

Paragraph 2. By deleting the word "or" and inserting the words "or while retrieving" in the last sentence thereof, so that the last sentence of Paragraph 2 as amended will read as follows:

"Retrievers which bark, give tongue or whine in line, in the blind, on a drive, or while retrieving should be penalized."

Paragraph 4. By striking out the last three sentences thereof reading as follows: "The handler may then have the option of working within the blind or of stepping out of the blind. Judges should grant this permission at any time in order to equalize the requirements of water work. A handler may use his gun in the blind at his option, only as the birds are shot, or an official gun may shoot for him."

and inserting in place thereof the following:

"The handler shall then direct his dog from within the blind, or from any other position designated by the judges."

Paragraph 17. By striking out said paragraph as now worded and inserting in place thereof the following:

"The awarding of certificates of merit to dogs which have passed every required test in a stake and have shown themselves to be well trained and qualified retrievers should be encouraged."

On motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that the following amendment to Chapter 17, Section 4 of Rules applying to Registration and Field Trials - Special Rules and Championship Points applying to Spaniels (except Brittany and Irish Water Spaniels) be approved:

By striking out the last sentence of said Section 4 and inserting in place thereof: "No handler shall carry any training or other handling equipment (except whistle) exposed or in such manner that it may be used as a steadying aid or threat," so that said Section 4 as amended will read as follows:

"In all stakes the spaniels shall be regularly shot over in the customary sporting manner, and may be worked up and down wind, and on fur and feather, as well as in water when possible. No handler shall carry any training or other handling equipment (except whistle) exposed or in such manner that it may be used as a steadying aid or threat."

On motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that the following amendment to Chapter 19-B, Section 23 of Rules applying to Registration and Dog Shows be approved:

By inserting after the word "classes" and before the word "other" in the last sentence of the first paragraph of said section, the words, "for individual dogs",

and by striking out of the second paragraph of said section, after the word "classes" and before the word "must", the words, "or otherwise", and inserting in said paragraph, after the word "whether" and before the word "they" the words, "or not", and after the word "classes" and before the word "other" the words, "for individual dogs",

so that said section, as amended, will read as follows:

SECTION 23. When the winners' class is divided by sex, the judge shall have the winners' dog and winners' bitch compete for "Best of Winners" and the dog thus designated shall be entitled to the number of points based on the number of dogs or bitches competing, whichever is greater, and then the dog so declared "Best of Winners" shall meet any dogs entered for "Specials Only", and any undefeated dogs which have competed at that show only in classes for individual dogs other than the regular official classes, all of which dogs must be brought into the ring, and the winner shall be adjudged "Best of Breed."

Where a special for Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed is offered to be competed for, all dogs entered for specials only of the opposite sex to the Best of Breed winner and any dogs of the same sex undefeated in their sex competition whether or not they have competed at that show only in classes for individual dogs other than the regular official classes must be brought into the ring, and the winner of these shall be adjudged Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed.

The following Standard Procedure or Running Rules for the conduct of Beagle Field Trials has been drawn up and recommended to the American Kennel Club by the Beagle Advisory Committee and the parent club for Beagles—National Beagle Club—and has been approved by the Board of Directors of the American Kennel Club.

Field Trial giving clubs will follow this Standard Procedure as closely as possible in the conduct of their trials. Local conditions may make slight variations necessary and changes and improvements may suggest themselves after the Rules are in actual operation. Clubs, after trying out these rules at their Fall, 1939, Trials are requested to notify the American Kennel Club in writing of any suggestions they may have for the improvement of this Procedure so that the National Beagle Club and the Advisory Committee may consider these suggestions at their Spring meetings.

All suggestions must be filed with the American Kennel Club by April 1, 1940.

### Standard Procedure or Running Rules for Beagle Field Trials

#### MANAGEMENT

RULE 1. The Field Trials shall be managed by a committee to be known as the Field Trial Committee which should consist of at least five members.

The Field Trial Committee shall appoint a Marshall to carry out their orders.

RULE 2. The Field Trial Committee shall have the power subject to the By-laws, Rules and Regulations of the American Kennel Club, to interpret the Running Rules of the Field Trial-giving Club and to decide all matters not provided for therein; to refuse any entry they think proper to exclude and to take action on any written objection to an entry; to suspend or debar from handling or entering hounds in any field trial of the Club any person who uses abusive language to the Judges or Officers of the Club, or who has been found to the satisfaction of the Field Trial Committee, to have conducted himself improperly in any measure in connection with dogs or field trials, or who is a defaulter for either stakes or forfeits in connection with field trials, or for money due under an arrangement for division of winnings, or for penalties for infraction of rules, or for any payment required by a decision of the Club.

#### **ENTRIES**

RULE 3, SECTION 1. All entries must be made on an entry blank furnished by the Field Trial-giving Club and must show all particulars as set forth in Chapter 9 of Section 2 of American Kennel Club Rules, and also the colors or distinguishing marks and the stake in which it is entered. Any hound proven not to correspond with its entry blank shall be disqualifield and all winnings and entry money shall be forfeited and should the act of fraudulent entry be proven, the owner or handler, or both, may be debarred from future competition in events held by any Club.

SECTION 2. All hounds must be registered or eligible to registration in the American Kennel Club Stud Book.

SECTION 3. The entrance fee must accompany every nomination.

SECTION 4. Castrated dogs or spayed bitches shall be debarred from competition in the events held by the Field Trial giving Club, and any such dog or bitch, proven to have been so run, with the knowledge of the owner or handler, or both, may be debarred from future competition in events held by the Club.

SECTION 5. Hounds affected with any contagious disease, shall not be permitted on the grounds or kennels where the trials are being run.

SECTION 6. In stakes, mixed as to sex, if in the opinion of the Field Trial Committee a bitch is in season, she shall be refused permission to run.

SECTION 7. Any objection to any entry must be made in writing, to the Secretary, preferably before the beginning of the stakes.

#### DRAWING AND ORDER OF RUNNING

RULE 4, SECTION 1. Before the drawing of each stake, the hounds entered in that stake, unless officially measured by the American Kennel Club, shall be measured by the Field Trial Committee or by a committee appointed by the Field Trial Committee. But, in no case shall the Committee consist of less than three persons. A measure made entirely of metal and meeting the requirements of the American Kennel Club must be used for the measuring.

Any hound eighteen months of age or over that has been measured at a field trial of the Field Trial-giving Club shall be recorded as of that measurement for all future trials of the Club. Nothing herein contained, however, shall prevent a hound's measurement being protested in accordance with the provisions of American Kennel Club Rules.

SECTION 2. The hounds entered in each stake shall be drawn by lot and braced accordingly for the first series running. Should two hounds owned by the same person be drawn in the same brace, the last hound so drawn will change places with the next hound drawn which is not so owned. This change will be made with a hound drawn later if possible, but may be made with a hound drawn earlier if necessary. The running together of two such hounds may be permitted in the first series when a separation is impossible, but in no other case. When a brace is called the Judges shall order the handlers to release their hounds.

SECTION 3. A brace mate for the bye hound in any series shall be selected by the Judges and shall be under judgement when so running.

SECTION 4. In stakes for packs, the packs shall be drawn by lot, and shall be run separately.

#### INSTRUCTIONS TO JUDGES

RULE 5. After the running of the first series has been completed, the Judges shall announce which hounds they wish to see run in the second series and may have them braced as desired. After the first series, Judges may exercise their own discretion as to running any or all braces and may brace them in any order or manner they think best, until they are satisfied as to the respective merits of the hounds. In no case shall any hound be run under judgment without a competing brace mate.

RULE 6. The Judges shall appoint a spokesman from their number, and all orders or information upon any point concerning the heat shall be given by him in a clear and impartial manner, so that each handler may have full benefit thereof.

RULE 7. Should there arise, at any time, during the running of a heat, questions bearing upon the actual running of the hounds and not provided for in these rules, the Judges are instructed to use their judgment, and discretion, and so decide the matter as to give each hound an equal opportunity.

RULE 8. Each heat shall be conducted in the manner best calculated to give the competitors an opportunity to display the qualities under judgment and each entry shall be given an equal opportunity on game.

RULE 9. The Judges shall give each brace in the first series at least thirty (30) minutes, except when in twenty (20) minutes the brace shall have been seen on game continuously or on two rabbits to the satisfaction of the judges, and shall order up the hounds as soon thereafter as they may determine, but if a hound persistently disobeys its handler or is lost, the Judges may order him up at the end of thirty (30) minutes whether he has been seen on game or not. Hounds may be ordered up upon the joint request of the handlers at any time.

RULE 10. Should a brace become split, the hounds going away on different rabbits, the Judges shall order both hounds up and the brace shall be put on game different from that before run by either hound.

RULE 11, SECTION 1. Judges are to consider that the Beagle is primarily a hunting hound and that his object is to first find game and second to drive it in an energetic and decisive manner and show an animated desire to overtake it. SECTION 2. Trailing game other than announced, such as pheasants or game animals, shall not be considered a demerit.

SECTION 3. Opening up in going to a bracemate who shows every evidence of being on game, shall not be a demerit.

SECTION 4. The number of times a hound finds game shall not necessarily give him the preference, but the quality of the performance shall be given first consideration. Ability and desire to hunt are of first importance. These points are evidenced by intelligence, the method of working ground and the ambition and industry displayed whether game is found or not.

SECTION 5. When a hound gives signs of being on game, the Judges shall allow him opportunity to prove whether or not he is on true trail. Judges shall not penalize or fault a hound without ample proof. If reasonable doubt exists, the hound shall be given the benefit of the doubt.

SECTION 6. If competition is close, the Judges shall give greater credit to the hound that is obedient to the commands of his handler. A hound will be expected to maintain an efficient range throughout a heat and to show hunting sense in his work. Huning sense is shown by the desire to hunt for game, the selection of likely places to hunt in, the method of hunting the places, the industry in staying out at work, and the skill in handling and trailing the game after it is found.

SECTION 7. In trailing and driving when the hounds overrun, if one hound shows either by voice or action, it has the line, and the other hound jumps in front on the line especially if it interferes with the work of the hound on the line, such hound shall receive no credit for any work until after it has picked up a check without aid from its bracemate. At a check, they should work industriously, close to where the loss occurred, before going further afield to look for the line.

RULE 12. Undue credit shall not be given for speed and flashy driving if the trail is not clearly followed. Accuracy in trailing, voice, endurance, starting ability, style and obedience, shall be the principal points of merit, but nothing in the foregoing shall excuse a hound for pottering, swinging, skirting, babbling, leaving checks, racing, running in hit or miss style, back tracking, running mute, running a ghost trail, all of which shall be considered demerits.

RULE 13. When a rabbit pursued by a brace runs into the gallery, or is frightened by the gallery, and the hounds show a disposition to lose, the Judges may at their discretion give the brace a new rabbit.

RULE 14. The Judges may announce the winner at any time after the second series; provided the first and second prize winners have run together.

RULE 15. In all stakes the Judges shall award places as follows: 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th. After these places have been awarded, the Judges shall designate the next best qualified hound as "Reserve". Reserve is not a place, but is simply the designation of a hound which shall automatically move up, into 4th place in case one of the hounds placed above him is later officially dsiqualified by proper authority.

RULE 16. Hounds running in all series shall be scored by percentages, and hounds for all series may come from same or different braces. Percentages in all series must be considered in awarding places.

RULE 17. In pack stakes, team work rather than individual work shall count. The hounds in the pack should be expected to hunt in the same manner as those in the individual stakes within easy distance of one another, to hark in quickly and to drive at an even speed well packed. If all the work is done by one or two, or a few of the hounds, and the others only run along it is not a good pack. A pack should be demerited if one or more of the hounds refuse to hark, skirt, show too great a desire

to run individually, or be out during the chase. If a stake calls for 8 couples there should be 16 hounds trying to stay or get in and if one or more are absent it is not an 8 couple pack. The master or huntsman may lift his hounds as often as circumstances require, the chief objective being to overtake the quarry.

RULE 18, SECTION 1. The Judges shall call to order a handler for making any unnecessary noise, or for any disorderly conduct calculated to in any way interfere with the opponent's hound. It shall be the duty of the Judges to call the offending party to order and see that this rule is at all times strictly enforced.

SECTION 2. Handlers, while their hounds are down shall go together and keep within sight of the Judges and each other when possible.

SECTION 3. A handler may speak or whistle to his hound or work him in any way he may deem proper, if not contrary to these rules, but he shall not make any unnecessary noise or interfere with an opponent's hound in any way.

SECTION 4. Owners and handlers are allowed the privilege of asking the Judges for information or for an explanation that has a direct bearing upon any point at issue.

SECTION 5. Handlers must keep themselves informed of the order of running and must be ready within hailing distance when their hounds are called. Any hound absent more than twenty minutes when called may be debarred at the discretion of the Field Trial Committee.

SECTION 6. When hounds have been laid on a line together or have harked in to one another, the duties of a handler shall cease until further instructed by the Judges. At a check the handler shall keep back of the Judges and hounds. Judges shall enforce this rule at all times.

Mr. Ferguson was deprived of the privileges of The American Kennel
Club was the date of the hearing, which was April 29, 1940.

New standard of perfection for the Irish Water Spaniel, as adopted by the American Spaniel Club, was approved and is as follows:

HEAD. Skull rather large and high in dome with prominent occiput; muzzle square and rather long with deep mouth opening and lips fine in texture. Teeth strong and level. The nose should be large with open nostrils and liver in color. The head should be cleanly chiselled, not "cheeky" and should not present a short wedge shaped appearance. Hair on face should be short and smooth.

TOPKNOT. Topknot, a characteristic of the true breed, should consist of long loose curls growing down into a well-defined peak between the eyes and should not be in the form of a wig; i.e. growing straight across.

EYES. Medium in size and set almost flush, without eyebrows. Color of eyes hazel, preferably of dark shade. Expression of the eyes should be keenly alert, intelligent, direct and quizzical.

EARS. Long, lobular, set low with leathers reaching to about the end of the nose when extended forward. The ears should be abundantly covered with curls becoming longer toward the tips and extending two or more inches below the ends of the leathers.

NECK. The neck should be long, arching, strong and muscular, smoothly set into sloping shoulders.

SHOULDERS AND CHEST. Shoulders should be sloping and clean; chest deep but not too wide between the legs. The entire front should give the impression of strength without heaviness.

BODY, RIBS AND LOINS. Body should be of medium length, with ribs well sprung, pear shaped at the brisket, and rounder toward the hindquarters. Ribs should be carried well back. Loins should be short, wide and muscular. The body should not present a tucked-up appearance.

HINDQUARTERS. The hindquarters should be as high or a trifle higher than the shoulders and should be very powerful and muscular with well developed upper and second thighs. Hips should be wide; stifles should not be too straight; and hocks low set and moderately bent. Tail should be set on low enough to give a rather rounded appearance to the hindquarters and should be carried nearly level with the back. Sound hindquarters are of great importance to provide swimming power and drive.

FORELEGS AND FEET. Forelegs medium in length, well boned, straight and muscular with elbows close set. Both fore and hind feet should be large, thick and somewhat spreading, well clothed with hair both over and between the toes, but free from superfluous feather.

TAIL. The so-called "rat-tail" is a striking characteristic of the breed. At the root it is thick and covered for two or three inches with short curls. It tapers to a fine point at the end, and from the root-curls is covered with short, smooth hair so as to look as if the tail had been clipped. The tail should not be long enough to reach the hock joint.

COAT. Proper coat is of vital importance. The neck, back and sides should be densely covered with tight crisp ringlets entirely free from wooliness. Underneath the ribs the hair should be longer. The hair on lower throat should be short. The forelegs should be covered all around with abundant hair falling in curls or waves, but shorter in front than behind. The hind legs should also be abundantly covered by hair falling in curls or waves, but the hair should be short on the front of the legs below the hocks.

COLOR. Solid liver; white on chest objectionable.

HEIGHT AND WEIGHT. Dogs 22 to 24 inches; bitches 21 to 23 inches. Dogs 55 to 65 pounds; bitches 45 to 58 pounds.

GENERAL APPEARANCE. That of a smart, upstanding, strongly built but not leggy dog, combining great intelligence and rugged endurance with a bold, dashing eagerness of temperament.

GAIT. Should be square, true, precise and not slurring.

On motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that the following proposed amendments to the Rules applying to Registration and Dog Shows and Field Trials be and they hereby are approved, to become effective forthwith:

(Show Rules)

CHAPTER 3, Section 14. By striking out the said Section as now worded and inserting in place thereof a Section to read as follows:

"If any person or persons shall desire to make use of a kennel or trade name in registering or showing dogs, application for the right to use such name must be made to the American Kennel Club on a form which will be supplied by said Club upon request, and such application must be accompanied by a fee, the amount of which shall be determined by the Board of Directors of the American Kennel Club. The Board will then consider such application and if it approves of the name selected will grant the right to the use of such name."

At present the fee is twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars.

CHAPTER 18, Section 2. By inserting in said Section after the word "cover" and before the word "This" the words "or title page," so that said Section as amended will read as follows:

"Every catalogue must bear on its cover or title page: 'This show is held under American Kennel Club Rules.'"

## (Field Trial Rules)

CHAPTER 2, Section 12. By striking out the said Section as now worded and inserting in place thereof a Section to read as follows:

"If any person or persons shall desire to make use of a kennel or trade name in registering or running dogs, application for the right to use such name must be made to the American Kennel Club on a form which will be supplied by said Club upon request, and such application must be accompanied by a fee, the amount of which shall be determined by the Board of Directors of the American Kennel Club. The Board will then consider such application and if it approves of the name selected will grant the right to the use of such name."

At present the fee is twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars.

CHAPTER 15, Section 1. Special Rules and Championship Points applying to Foxhounds. By adding at the end of said Section the words "provided the trial is of not less than four days' duration."

CHAPTER 16. Special Rules and Championship Points applying to Retrievers and Irish Water Spaniels. By striking out said Chapter 16 as now worded and inserting a new Chapter 16, as follows:

CHAPTER 16. Section 1. Field Trial clubs or specialty clubs formed for the improvement of any one of the several breeds of Retrievers and/or Irish Water Spaniels may give field trial stakes in which one of said breeds only may compete, or in which more than one of said breeds may compete together.

Championship points may be awarded where two or more of said breeds compete together in a mixed stake as well as where a separate stake has been provided for each breed.

Only pure-bred Retrievers and/or Irish Water Spaniels may be entered in field trials.

Section 2. In stakes for Retrievers and/or Irish Water Spaniels, the order of running shall be decided by lot at the draw, dogs worked by the same person or belonging to the same owner being separated when possible. At the end of the first series, the judges will call up all dogs which they wish to try further and will cause them to be run in additional series until the stake is decided. Judges shall in their discretion determine the number of dogs that shall be worked simultaneously.

Section 3. In Novice Handler Stakes dogs must be handled by persons who have never handled a placed dog in any licensed or member club Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel trial in the United States nor in any Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Trial in Great Britain or Canada.

Section 4. In all stakes the dogs shall be regularly shot over in the customary manner by guns appointed by the Field Trial Committee and in licensed or member club trials shall be worked both on land and in water in all stakes. No handler shall carry any training or other handling equipment (except whistle) exposed or in such manner that it may be used as a steadying aid or threat. At

the discretion of the judges a handler may shoot from the blind or an official gun may shoot for him. If, in the opinion of the judges, conditions are not suitable for testing puppies in the water, this stake shall be abandoned.

Section 5. Only stakes which are run on game birds and on both land and water shall be permitted to carry champion-ship points.

Section 6. Judges shall have the power to disqualify any dog which shall not appear within fifteen minutes of the time designated for its turn to be tried.

Section 7. Judges shall have the power to turn out of the stake any dog which does not obey its handler and any handler who interferes wilfully with another handler or his dog, and the power to exclude from competition bitches in season or any dog which the Judges may consider unfit to compete. The entry fees of all such dogs shall be forfeited except in cases of bitches in season.

Section 8. The owner or agent entering a dog in a Trial does so at his own risk, and agrees to abide by the rules of the American Kennel Club.

Section 9. In the event of the weather proving unsuitable for holding the Trials, it shall be in the power of the Field Trial Committee to postpone the Trials up to 30 days, provided such postponements do not conflict with any other Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial, and that notice of each postponement is immediately forwarded to the American Kennel Club. After postponements for 30 days the provisions of Section 10 of this Chapter shall come into operation.

Section 10. In the event of the weather still proving unsuitable after postponements for 30 days, the Field Trial Committee may then abandon the Trial at any time, on returning the entry fees to the competitors. If, from unforeseen circumstances, the Field Trial Committee deem it advisable to alter the date of the Trial after the closing of the entries, this may be done with the consent of the American Kennel Club and by sending formal notice to all competitors, who may exercise the option of cancelling their entries within four days from the date of such notice, in which event their entry fees will be returned to them. All entries, however, in regard to which no such option is exercised will stand good for the Trial at its altered date.

Section 11. The decisions of the Field Trial Committee present shall be final and conclusive in all matters arising at the Meeting, and shall bind all parties, subject however to the rules of the American Kennel Club.

Section 12. After a Field Trial Committee has selected field trial grounds no dog shall be trained on that part of the grounds to be used for the trials.

Section 13. Splitting of prizes and/or places at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial is prohibited.

Section 14. No gun smaller than twelve gauge shall be used in Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Stakes carrying championship points. The size of shot and load to be used shall be approved by the Field Trial Committee of the Club holding the field trial.

Section 15. The regular official stakes at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Trial shall be "Puppy Stake," "Derby Stake," "Novice Stake," "Non-Winners Stake," "Open All-Age Stake" and "Limited All Age Stake."

Section 16. A Puppy Stake at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial shall be for dogs six months and not exceeding twelve months of age. The age of a dog shall be calculated up to and inclusive of the day preceding the first day of the Trial.

Section 17. A Derby Stake at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial shall be for dogs whelped on or after the first day of January of the year preceding that year in which the stake is run.

Section 18. A Novice Stake at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial shall be for dogs which never have won first place in a Novice Stake nor any place or Certificate of Merit in any other regular official Field Trial Stake at a licensed or member club trial. Wins in Puppy or Derby Stakes excepted. Only dogs whelped in the United States or Canada, and dogs that have been imported and registered in the American Kennel Club Stud Book prior to reaching the age of one year, shall be eligible.

Section 19. A Non-Winners Stake at a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial shall be for dogs which have never won first, second, third or fourth place in an Open All Age or Limited All Age Stake or won first place in a Non-Winners Stake at a licensed or member club trial.

Section 20. An Open All Age Stake at a Retriever and/ or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial shall be for all dogs over six months of age.

Section 21. A Limited All Age Stake at a Retriever and/ or Irish Water Spaniel Field Trial shall be for dogs over six months of age that have previously been placed or received an American Kennel Club Certificate of Merit in an Open All Age Stake or that have been placed first, second or third in a Derby, Novice or Non-Winners Stake at a licensed or member club trial.

Section 22. A Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel shall become a Field Trial Champion of Record after having won points in open all age and/or limited all age stakes at Field Trials of member clubs of the American Kennel Club or at field trials of non-member clubs licensed by the American Kennel Club to hold field trials.

Section 23. The total number of points required for a championship, the number of places in a stake for which points may be acquired, the number of points to be acquired for each place, and the number of starters required and their qualifications for eligibility to acquire points in each stake shall be fixed and determined by the Board of Directors of the American Kennel Club.

(At present to acquire a Field Trial championship a Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel must win a total of 10 points, which may be acquired as follows: In each open all age or limited all age stake there must be at least 12 starters and winner of 1st place shall be credited with 5 points, 2nd place - 3 points, and 3rd place - 1 point, but before acquiring a championship a dog must win first place and acquire 5 points in at least one open all age or limited all age stake and not more than 5 points of the required 10 shall be acquired in stakes limited to any one breed of Retriever and/or Irish Water Spaniel.)

Standard Procedure for Non-Slip Retriever Trials.

Paragraph 2. By deleting the word "or" and inserting the words "or while retrieving" in the last sentence thereof, so that the last sentence of Paragraph 2 as amended will read as follows:

"Retrievers which bark, give tongue or whine in line, in the blind, on a drive, or while retrieving should be penalized."

Paragraph 4. By striking out the last three sentences thereof reading as follows: "The handler may then have the option of working within the blind or of stepping out of the blind. Judges should grant this permission at any time in order to equalize the requirements of water work. A handler may use his gun in the blind at this option, only as the birds are shot, or an official gun may shoot for him."

and inserting in place thereof the following:

"The handler shall then direct his dog from within the blind, or from any other position designated by the judges."

Paragraph 17. By striking out said paragraph as now worded and inserting in place thereof the following:

"The awarding of certificates of merit to dogs which have passed every required test in a stake and have shown themselves to be well trained and qualified retrievers should be encouraged."

CHAPTER 17, Section 4. Special Rules and Championship Points applying to Spaniels (except Brittany and Irish Water Spaniels):

By striking out the last sentence of said Section 4 and inserting in place thereof:

"No handler shall carry any training or other handling equipment (except whistle) exposed or in such manner that it may be used as a steadying aid or threat,"

so that said Section 4 as amended will read as follows:

"In all stakes the spaniels shall be regularly shot over in the customary sporting manner, and may be worked up and down wind, and on fur and feather, as well as in water when possible. No handler shall carry any training or other handling equipment (except whistle) exposed or in such manner that it may be used as steadying aid or threat."

On motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that the proposed amendment to Chapter 19-B, Section 23, of the Rules applying to Registration and Dog Shows, be amended to read as follows:

By striking out at the beginning of the last paragraph the words:

"Where a special for Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed is offered to be competed for" and inserting in place thereof the words:

"After judging Best of Breed the judge shall designate Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed", so that said paragraph as amended shall read:

"After judging 'Best of Breed' the judge shall designate 'Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed' and all dogs entered for specials only of the opposite sex to the Best of Breed winner and any dogs of the same sex undefeated in their sex competition whether or not they have competed at that show only in classes for individual dogs other than the regular official classes must be brought into the ring, and the winner of these shall be adjudged Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed,"

and also by inserting in the proper place

"The ribbon to be awarded to 'Eest of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed' shall be purple and silver."

Description and Standard of Points of The American Water Spaniel.

### GENERAL APPEARANCE -

Medium in size, of sturdy typical spaniel character, curly coat, an active muscular dog, with emphasis placed on proper size and conformation, correct head properties, texture of coat and color. Of amicable disposition; demeanor indicates intelligence, strength and endurance.

#### HEAD -

Moderate in length, skull rather broad and full, stop moderately defined, but not too pronounced. Forehead covered with short smooth hair and without tuft or topknot. Muzzle of medium length, square and with no inclination to snipiness, jaws strong and of good length, and neither undershot nor overshot, teeth straight and well shaped. Nose sufficiently wide and with well developed nostrils to insure good scenting power.

#### FAULTS -

Very flat skull, narrow across the top, long, slender or snipy muzzle.

#### EYES -

Hazel, brown or of dark tone to harmonize with coat; set well apart. Expression alert, attractive, intelligent.

#### FAULT -

Yellow eyes to disqualify.

#### EARS -

Lobular, long and wide, not set too high on head, but slightly above the eyeline. Leather extending to end of nose and well covered with close curls.

## NECK -

Round and of medium length, strong and muscular, free of throatiness, set to carry head with dignity, but arch not accentuated.

#### BODY STRUCTURE -

Well developed, sturdily constructed but not too compactly coupled. General outline is a symmetrical relationship of parts. Shoulders sloping, clean and muscular. Strong loins, lightly arched and well furnished, deep brisket but not excessively broad. Well sprung ribs. Legs of medium length and well boned, but not so short as to handicap for field work.

#### LEGS AND FEET-

Forelegs powerful and reasonably straight. Hindlegs firm with suitable bent stifles and strong hocks well let down. Feet to harmonize with size of dog. Toes closely grouped and well padded.

#### FAULT -

Cow Hocks.

TAIL -

Moderate in length, curved in a slightly rockershape, carried slightly below level of back; tapered and covered with hair to tip, action lively.

FAULTS -

Rat or shaved tail.

COAT -

The coat should be closely curled or have marcel effect and should be of sufficient density to be of protection against weather, water or punishing cover, yet not coarse. Legs should have medium short, curly feather.

FAULTS -

Coat too straight, soft, fine or tightly kinked.

COLOR -

Solid liver or dark chocolate, a little white on toes or chest permissible.

HEIGHT -

15 to 18 inches at the shoulder.

WEIGHT -

Males 28 to 45 lbs; Females 25 to 40 lbs.

CHAPTER 15, Section 13. By striking out said section as now worded and inserting in place thereof the following:

Section 13. Every premium list shall specify the date on which the entries for the show shall close. All entries must be received in time for publication in the catalogue.

CHAPTER 4. By inserting between the first and second paragraphs of said chapter, two new paragraphs to read as follows:

A member show with limited entries, at which championship points may be awarded, may be given by a Club or Association which is a member of the American Kennel Club provided said Club or Association shall have been a member for and shall have held shows each year for ten or more years immediately prior to the year in which application is made for its first show with limited entries and further provided that there shall have been not less than 1500 dogs entered at its show next preceding its first show with limited entries.

Only dogs that have previously been placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd in a regular official class at a show at which championship points were awarded shall be eligible for entry in a show with limited entries except that if it is so provided in the premium list entries may be accepted of any puppies eligible for entry in the regular official puppy classes.

CHAPTER 7, Section 8. By adding at the end of said section a new paragraph to read as follows:

A member club holding a show with limited entries may include Winners Classes provided the necessary regular classes are included in the classification.

Mr. E.E. Ferguson appeared before the Board in the matter of his appeal from the decision of the Los Angeles Trial Board.

The Board discussed the case following Mr. Ferguson's departure, and on motion duly made and seconded, it was voted, THAT THE CHARGES were not proved to the satisfaction of the Board on review. Mr. Charles T. Inglee and Mr. Wm. L. Smalley wished to be recorded as voting in the negative.

CHAPTER 7, Section 8. By adding at the end of said section a new paragraph to read as follows:

A member club holding a show with limited entries may include Winners Classes provided the necessary regular classes are included in the classification.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that the judging licenses of Mrs. G.G. Flory, Reuben Clarke, and Erik Bergishagen be revoked, as they are ineligible, under the rules, to hold judging licenses.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that certain sections of the Regulations and Standard for Obedience Trials be and they hereby are amended to read as follows:

SECTION 1. A club or association which has been granted permission to hold a dog show may also be granted permission to hold in connection with the show any or all of the obedience classes defined in this chapter, except Tracking Tests, if in the opinion of the Board of Directors of the American Kennel Club such club or association is qualified to do so.

SECTION 4. (Novice Class A). The Obedience Novice Class "A" shall be for dogs of any breed and of either sex which have not won the title of "C.D." (Companion Dog). One dog only may be entered in

this class by any one exhibitor, and may be shown only by said exhibitor or by a member of his immediate family, except that an exhibitor entering one dog in Novice Class A and one other dog in Novice Class B must have an assistant to handle the Novice Class B dog in the "sit and down" exercise if this exercise for both classes is judged together. No professional handler or trainer, nor any kennel employee, shall be allowed to compete as exhibitor or otherwise.

SECTION 5. (Novice Class B). The Obedience Novice Class "B" shall be for dogs of any breed and of either sex which have not won the title of "C.D." (Companion Dog). Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by either an amateur or a professional. Exhibitors may enter more than one dog in this class, but each dog must have a separate handler for the "sit and down" exercise. No dog may be entered in both Novice Class "A" and Novice Class "B" at any one Trial.

SECTION 6. The tests in the Obedience Novice Class for each dog shall be:

- 1. To heel on leash.
- 2. To heel free, stand stay.
- 3. To come when called.
- 4. To sit for a period of one minute away from handler.
- 5. To lie down for a period of three minutes away from handler.

SECTION 8. The score of points for a perfect performance of each of these tests in the Obedience Novice Class shall be:

Maximum Total Score ...... 100 points

SECTION 12. (Open Class A). The Obedience Open Class "A" shall be for dogs of any breed and of either sex which shall have won the title of "C.D." (Companion Dog) in Obedience Novice Classes. One dog only may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor, and may be shown only by said exhibitor or by a member of his immediate family, except that an exhibitor entering one dog in Open Class A and one other dog in Open Class B must have an assistant to handle the Open Class B dog in the "sit and down" exercise if this exercise for both classes is judged together. No professional handler or trainer, nor any kennel employee, shall be allowed to compete as exhibitor or otherwise. No dog that has won the title of C.D.X. shall be entered in this class.

SECTION 13. (Open Class B). The Obedience Open Class "B" shall be for dogs of any breed and of either sex which shall have won the title of "C.D." (Companion Dog". Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by either an amateur or a professional.

Exhibitors may enter more than one dog in this class, but each dog must have a separate handler for the "sit and down" exercise. No dog may be entered in both Open Class "A" and Open Class "B" at any one Trial.

SECTION 21. The tests in the Obedience Utility Class for each dog shall be:

- 1. To speak on command.
- 2. To exercise scent discrimination.
- 3. To seek back for lost articles.
- 4. To stand for examination.
- 5. To execute hurdle and bar jump.

SECTION 22. The score of points for a perfect performance of each of these tests in the Obedience Utility Class shall be:

- 1. Speak on Command ......45 points
- 2. Exercise Scent Discrimination .45 points
- 3. Seek back for lost article ....40 points
- 4. Stand for examination ......30 points
- 5. Hurdle and Bar Jump .....40 points

Maximum Total Score ......200 points

SECTION 24. The American Kennel Club will permit the use of the letters "U.D.", signifying "Utility Dog", to be used in connection with and after the name of each dog which shall be certified by Judges to have received scores of 180 or more points in Obedience Utility Classes and in addition thereto have been awarded a Tracking Test certificate.

SECTION 25. The total number of dogs required to compete in the Utility Class and in the Tracking Test, and the number of Obedience Utility Classes in which a dog must receive a score of 180 or more points in order to be permitted to use the letters "U.D.", shall be fixed and determined by the Board of Directors of the American Kennel Club.

At present to be permitted to use the letters "U.D." a dog must receive a score of 180 or more points in Utility Classes at three Obedience Trials in each of which classes two or more dogs were competing, and in addition must have been awarded a Tracking Test certificate in a Tracking Test in which three or more dogs were competing.

SECTION 27. If ribbons are given at sanctioned obedience trials they shall be of the following colors:

First Prize . . . . . Rose
Second Prize . . . . . Brown
Third Prize . . . . Light Green
Fourth Prize . . . . . . Gray

All prize ribbons shall have the words "Obedience Trial" printed on them.

SECTION 28. Bitches in season not permitted to compete. The Judge of an Obedience Trial must remove from competition any dog which does not obey its handler, any handler who interferes wilfully with another competitor or his dog, and bitches in heat, and may exclude from competition any dog which he considers unfit to compete.

SECTION 30. The decisions of the Obedience Trial Committee present shall be conclusive in all matters arising at the Trial and shall bind all parties, subject however, to the Rules of the American Kennel Club.

STANDARD for Obedience Trials. Paragraph 3. In the Novice and Open Classes the handler should enter the ring with his dog on loose leash, stand still with dog sitting at heel at the handler's left side until the Judge asks if the handler is ready and then gives the order "Forward", at which command the handler will attract his dog's attention by saying his name and then give the order "Heel" and at the same time start walking briskly with the dog on loose leash. At the command "Heel" the dog should follow as closely as possible to the left knee of the handler. At each order to "Halt" the handler will stop and his dog immediately should sit without command at heel and not move until ordered to do so. It is permissible after each halt before moving again for the handler to give the order "Heel" to his dog. Any tightening or jerking of the leash, or any act, signal or command, which in the opinion of the Judge gives the dog unnecessary or unfair assistance shall be penalized. The Judge will give the orders, "Left turn", "Right turn", "About turn", "Slow" and "Fast", which last order signifies that the handler must run. In executing the "about turn" the handler will use a "right about turn" unless the Judge specifically calls for a "left about turn". The Judge will order the handler to execute the "Figure Eight", which signifies that the the handler shall walk around and in between the two stewards who shall stand not more than eight feet apart, or if there is only one steward shall walk around and in between the Judge and the steward. In the "Stand Stay" the handler while walking his dog "heel free" at the command of judge, dog is ordered to "Stand Stay"; the handler continuing walking to approximately 15 feet away from dog before stopping and facing dog. The dog should hold the "Stand Stay" position for about 30 seconds, allowing judge to walk around him, after which the judge to give order to finish exercise as in recall.

Paragraph 5. To execute the recall to handler the dog is ordered to and must be made to stay in the "Down" or sitting position at one end of the ring while his handler moves to the other end, and when the Judge gives the order "Do the Recall", the handler calls his dog, which in the Novice Class must come straight in to its handler at a smart pace and when it reaches a point immediately in front of the handler, first sit, and next at command or signal go smartly to heel. In the Open Class, at command or signal the dog is told to drop as it is coming in, and then on command or signal rises and continues on its way and when it reaches a point immediately in front of the handler, first sit and then finish.

Paragraph 9. In retrieving dumbbell on the flat the dog should not move forward to retrieve nor deliver to hand on return until ordered by the handler. The retrieve should be executed at a fast trot or gallop without mouthing or playing with the object. After delivering the object from in front of handler the dog upon command or signal should go to heel. The size of the dumbbell may vary in proportion to the size of the dog. The weight of the dumbbell for all breeds except the smaller breeds shall be about 16 oz., and for smaller breeds about 8 oz. The orders given by the Judge in this test should be "Throw it", whereupon the handler throws the dumbbell; "Send him", whereupon the handler sends his dog to retrieve; "Take it", whereupon the handler takes the dumbbell from dog; "Finish", whereupon the handler gives the order to heel.

Paragraph 11. The broad or long jump shall consist of four separate hurdles, built to telescope for convenience, ten inches high at the highest point. When set up they shall be spaced so that the jump shall be six feet over all, except for the smaller breeds, for which hurdles shall be removed in proportion to size of dog. In the execution of the broad jump the handler shall stand at the side of the jump within the range of the first and last hurdles. All jumps should be painted white or a very light color.

Suggestions for Obedience Trial Judges. Paragraph 7.

Care must be taken not to score the first dog so high that allowance may not be made for a dog giving a better performance. Also judges should not be too lenient in their markings, as dogs should not attain their titles upon work of poor quality. Scores should be marked according to the dog's performance in all exercises. For example: "On the "sit and down" a dog that walks out of the ring should be penalized more than a dog that only moves a few feet.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that the Regulations and Standard for Obedience Trials be and they hereby are amended by providing new sections and paragraph as follows:

CHAPTER 1, Section 32. No entry shall be made at any Obedience Trial under a judge of any dog which said judge or any member of his immediate household has owned, sold, held under lease or boarded within one year prior to the date of the trial.

Section 33. In order to win any degree in an Obedience Trial qualifying scores must be obtained under at least two different judges.

Section 34. No dog may enter or use the Obedience Trial rings prior to the judging. Note: Superintendents will please post a sign to this effect in the ring.

STANDARD. Paragraph 16. Hurdle and Bar Jump. In this exercise the dog shall walk at "heel free" carrying dumbbell to a position in front of hurdle. From heel position carrying dumbbell the dog to jump hurdle. From a heel position the dog to jump bar and finish as in recall.

(Present paragraphs 16 and 17 to be renumbered 17 and 18 respectively.)

Letter dated November 9, 1940, addressed to the President, and letter dated November 9, 1940, addressed to the Board of Directors, both from Mr. Frank Foster Davis, were read by the President. The President also brought to the attention of the Board again the letters dated September 20 and 24, 1940, from Mr.Davis addressed to the Board, and the letter dated September 24, 1940 addressed to Miss P.B. Everett, Manager License Department, together with all data concerning Mr. Davis since he was granted a judging license on June 17, 1929.

After careful consideration of all the above, it was the unanimous decision of the members of the Board that they saw no reason to change their opinion as expressed to Mr. Davis by our Secretary's letter of October 21, 1940.
