

Sample Letter to Lawmakers – Breeder Regulations

RE: Oppose <Bill #>

I am writing you today because I am a constituent and I am concerned about <Bill #>, a measure that would impose unreasonable regulations on responsible dog breeders.

Instead, please work on legislation that will address the real issue – irresponsible ownership – and the enforcement of existing animal cruelty laws without taking away the rights of responsible breeders.
